	ÓSHA	Tips for Preparing for OSHA's Site Specific Targeting Program Earlier this year, the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) released information on their latest Site Specific Targeting (SST) Program. The OSHA SST program targets industries with elevated injury and illness experience by instituting a program of comprehensive safety and health inspections. This year's program targets manufacturing establishments with a Days Away From Work Restricted or Transferred (DART) rate in excess of 7.0, or Lost Workday Injury and Illness rates in excess of 5.0, based on calendar year 2010 data.

Toxics Use Reduction Reports Due July 1st

The Toxics Use Reduction Act (TURA) requires that Massachusetts companies using large quantities of specific toxic chemicals evaluate and plan for pollution prevention opportunities, implement them if practical, and annually measure and report the results.

This year's toxics use reports, which contain information for calendar year 2012, are due (filed online or postmarked), by July 1, 2013

EPA's Toxic Release Inventory (TRI) Reporting Due July 1st

The reporting year (RY) 2012 versions of <u>TRI-MEweb</u>, the <u>TRI reporting forms and instructions</u>, the <u>TRI</u> chemical list, and the Threshold Screening Tool are now available for facilities to begin reporting for RY 2012. The deadline to submit TRI forms for RY 2012 is midnight on July 1, 2013. As a reminder to facilities submitting paper forms, these can now be completed online prior to printing.
